This month, we are pleased to feature Henry Kaminer '50 who was generous enough to share his thoughts with us.

"I grew up in a tiny shtetle in the East Bronx. In high school I learned about the big world outside and I learned how to be a human being. I also was enraptured by the experience of intellectual and emotional growth and so many different fields. The teachers were models of how to be scholars and lovers of knowledge. They were also mature, understanding, responsible and loving adults. In later life, I had the good fortune to befriend Anna Burton, daughter of Morris Meister! Ironically, she could not attend Bronx Science because she was a girl. Luckily, the policy changed and some of the most talented and amazing girls I ever met attended Bronx Science.

One incident to tell you – there was a citywide teachers strike and of course our radical students wanted to go out on strike to support the teachers. Only a small token number of teachers were at City Hall. Despite the pleadings of the faculty the students had a big meeting in the auditorium and they walked out triumphantly. They went of course to the Paradise theater around the corner to enjoy the afternoon. Only Peter Schwartzman and myself went downtown to see what a strike was like. It was very exciting and we had the experience of being chased by police on horseback. Every minute in that school was an enriching experience."
